Our spirit is rooted in a commitment to the environment through composting, recycling and continually seeking greener ways to work. In partnership with the National Aquarium's mission to celebrate and nurture the world's aquatic habitats, our menus offer "Best Choice" or "Good Alternative" seafood as outlined by Seafood Watch. As a member of the Oyster Recovery Partnership Shell Recycling Alliance, the shells of the native Eastern or American oysters served at our events, are collected and used to support oyster population growth in the Chesapeake Bay. Our commissary and kitchens have implemented a 100% composting program for all waste.

## **Environmental Restoration or Community Environmental Projects**

In partnership with the Oyster Recovery Partnership: We recycled 23.4 bushels in 2016, with 500 shells in every bushel. An average of 10 baby oysters per bushel get seeded and planted back in the Bay's watershed. We put 117,000 back in our local waterways.

> The reuse of oyster shells reduces our waste stream by approximately 468 pounds annually.

#### $\mathbf{\nabla}$ Composting

In 2016, we diverted 47.03 tons, or 94,600 pounds, of organic material for composting.
