Management and Leadership

Environmental Policy Statement

Tulkoff has formalized its energy conservation and sustainability efforts by establishing a policy and procedure to form a "Green Team" to observe, promote and correct energy inefficiencies. The President and Vice President of Operations are responsible for implementing the policy.

Environmental Team

Tulkoff's Green Team consists of seven members from a cross section of departments and is chaired by the Vice President of Operations. It meets at least monthly to discuss existing energy leaks/inefficiencies as well as energy conservation solutions. The team also engages all Tulkoff employees to achieve their goals and solutions through education, leading by example and special internal campaigns.

Recycling

Tulkoff recycles the following:

- 1. Cardboard. 12,000lbs/month at an annual cost savings of \$4,000 in landfill fees.*
- 2. Used pallets. 300/month at a cost savings of \$3,600.*

Energy Efficiency

Tulkoff is currently participating in the RMI energy efficiency program. We have had an audit and have installed energy efficient lighting throughout our facility. Much of this lighting is motion activated.

Our building was constructed with a white membrane roof to reflect the sun and we also participate in the EnerNOC peak load usage monitoring program.

Transportation

Employee Commute

Our building was constructed near public transportation to limit the need for vehicle commuting.

Fleet Vehicles

We have reduced our fleet from five vehicles to just one and reduced the number of annual vehicle mileage.

Water

Stormwater Management and Site Design

Our property meets all requirements for storm water management, but we have also improved the property by planting more than of 50 new trees and shrubs.
