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Lead registry project succeeds

Maryland Governor Robert L. Ehrlich Jr. committed the state to eliminating childhood lead poisoning in the next six years, as he and Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) Secretary Kendl P. Philbrick joined advocates and parents Nov. 23 to announce the successful details of an initiative aimed at boosting the state's lead rental property registry.

Under Maryland law all pre-1950 constructed residential rental units (an estimated 135,000) must be registered with MDE's Lead Poisoning Prevention Program. Working with the state Department of Assessments and Taxation, MDE developed

a mailing list of 50,000 potential unregistered units. A letter was sent to property owners this past summer describing the requirements of Maryland's lead laws. That targeted outreach effort netted 17,000 new registrations —well beyond the Governor's target of 10,000.

"A decade ago in Maryland, nearly a quarter of children

tested had elevated blood lead levels," Governor Ehrlich said. "In 2003 the number was 2.2 percent. This is extraordinary progress, but our ultimate goal is to get that number down to zero by 2010. And we all know, increasing the pool of property owners voluntarily complying with the law is the key to achiev-

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Panels issue water reports

Two workgroups tasked with reviewing Maryland's water and wastewater programs issued their recommendations to the state's leadership Dec. 22. Their findings will result in actions that could impact county and municipal governments, citizens and the private sector.

The Water Security and Wastewater Systems Advisory Council and Interagency Technical Assistance Committee on Wastewater Treatment Systems delivered the report to sponsoring committees of the General Assembly and to Governor Robert L. Ehrlich Jr. earlier this month.

Since March, the Water Security and Wastewater Systems Advisory Council focused on matters

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Staying warm while saving energy is easy

Cold winter temperatures and days with fewer hours of daylight are here. Meaning it's time to dig out the sweaters, coats and gloves. Dust off the boots. Find the snow shovel. Whew! Preparing for winter can be a lot of work. And there may be more things to do, especially to keep your home warm, utility costs lower and conserve energy.

Energy costs are expected to be high this winter. The U.S. Department of Energy made the following predictions about energy costs this winter: Average residential natural gas prices are expected to be 11 percent higher than they were last winter, and household expenditures are expected to be 15 percent higher. Heating oil prices are expected to average 29 percent higher compared with last winter and household expenditures are expected to be 28 percent higher. Propane prices are expected to average 17 percent above last winter, with 22 percent higher expenditures for propaneheated households.

Want to trim monthly expenses? Use less fuel? Contribute to a cleaner environment? Then take a long hard look at how you use household appliances and how well prepared your house is for reducing energy use. Energy conservation is one way to fight higher electric and heating bills. Energy conservation also helps protect air quality because emissions from power plants are reduced. You can do more than turn off lights when not in use.

We have all heard the familiar business adage "location, location, location, location, with adage for winterizing your home should be "insulation, insulation, insulation." Check to ensure that the house is sealed to prevent cold air from en-

tering. Cold air can enter through gaps between framing material, through holes drilled for plumbing and wiring, around doors and windows. Check to see if there is sufficient insulation material on the attic floor. A properly maintained heating system also saves money and conserves fuel. Here are additional tasks that can keep your house warm:

- Seal gaps in walls with caulk or concrete
- Replace broken or cracked window glass and cracked glazing
- Install storm windows over single pane windows or replace single pane windows with energy efficient double pane windows
- Seal joints in sheet metal ducts with duct tape
- Replace furnace filters once a month during the heating season
- Close curtains and shades at night
- Allow sunlight through windows during the day

Another way to save on heating costs is to keep the thermostat as low as is comfortable (65 to 68 degrees Fahrenheit is suggested) when the house is occupied and to set the thermostat back by 10 degrees at night or when the house is unoccupied. A programmable thermostat is an inexpensive investment (\$40 to \$99) that will automatically adjust the temperature. The thermostat could generate enough savings in fuel costs to pay for itself in one month.

Other ways to reduce utility costs and conserve energy are to buy energy-efficient appliances when older appliances need replacement. For example, many older gas-cooking stoves have continuous burning pilot lights. Replace with a gas stove that has a closed electric ignition system.

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Businesses earn awards for work that supports Bay

Maryland Department of the Environment Secretary Kendl P. Philbrick presented awards to small, medium, and large businesses and government facilities located within the Chesapeake Bay watershed that have implemented successful pollution prevention projects in 2003. The awards were presented at the Businesses for the Bay Annual Meeting Oct. 14 at the National Wildlife Visitor Center, Patuxent Research Refuge, in Laurel Maryland. The Governor also recognized Maryland manufacturers that have successfully completed an Environmental Management System Implementation Program sponsored by the Maryland Department of the Environment and Maryland Technology Extension Service.

Businesses for the Bay is a voluntary program that encourages and recognizes pollution prevention practices at businesses, government facilities, and other organizations located within the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Pollution prevention, or P2, is an environmental management approach that aims to reduce or eliminate waste prior to recycling, treatment, or disposal. P2 practices also include the increased efficiency of the use of raw materials, energy and water.

More than 600 organizations throughout the watershed are participating members in *Businesses for the Bay*. Since the program's inception in 1996, program participants throughout the Chesapeake Bay watershed have reported the reduction and recycling of 7.3 billion pounds of waste and materials at a cost savings of \$892 million. These wastes ranged from specific chemicals to air emissions and

solid waste. Secretary Philbrick remarked, "These results represent just a small fraction of the potential reductions that can be achieved through pollution prevention measures throughout the Chesapeake Bay watershed. We are fortunate to have a regional organization like *Businesses for the Bay* to carry this message and help tap this potential."

Cool & wet equals good air quality for area

Summer of '04 listed only one Code Red

The summer of 2004 featured cool, cloudy and wet conditions when compared to a 'normal' Maryland summer. Perfect conditions for keeping the lawn green and flowers happy, but less than ideal for getting the perfect tan or producing ozone.

During a normal summer (May – September) Maryland would experience about 30 days with maximum temperatures at or above 90 degrees Fahrenheit, but this past summer the thermometer only reached or exceeded that mark on 10 days. With the below normal maximum temperatures came above normal precipitation. During the summer the Maryland region experienced rainfall that equaled or exceeded .01 inches on 65 of 153 days or 42 percent of the time. A total of 24.42 inches (or approximately two feet) of rain fell on the region and this was approximately 5.71 inches above normal. The wettest month of the summer was July, which had 8.69 inches of precipitation (an astounding 4.84 inches above normal).

The next logical question one might ask is why was the summer of 2004 so wet and cool? It was a combination of things. First an area of high pressure, known as the Bermuda High, usually forms off the coast of Maryland. This past summer the Bermuda High formed and stayed further south and east than normal and never got close enough to cause temperatures to climb into the 90s on a consistent basis. At the same time a persistent area of low pressure formed to the north in Canada near Hudson Bay. This in turn helped keep rain and clouds in the Maryland region.

As mentioned earlier this uncharacteristic summer weather kept the Maryland region wet and cloudy. This lack of sunshine and hot temperatures kept ozone concentrations low. In fact Maryland recorded only one Bad Air Day (Code Red) during the entire summer. Code Red indicates the air quality is poor and can cause respiratory distress for even healthy people. In comparison Maryland usually averages 10 Bad Air Days during the summer. Overall Maryland had 92 Code Green days (good air quality), 46 Code Yellow days (mild air pollution), nine Code Orange days (unhealthy air for people with respiratory problems), and one Code Red day.

This past summer featured some very interesting weather events that folks in the Maryland region will not soon forget. Aside from the normal average severe thunderstorms we expect during the summer, Maryland experienced some slow moving afternoon downpours that turned roads into rivers and flooded many basements. Several hurricanes and tropical storms came through the area to cause more flooding, above normal tides and strong winds. In addition, the area witnessed damage and destruction associated with tornadoes.

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relating to the security of water and wastewater facilities, chlorine and alternative disinfections and new technologies. The Interagency Technical Assistance Committee evaluated technical assistance to small and medium communities, user rates, public education, infrastructure needs and costs, and water and sewer planning.

"Going through this process was important and crucial work if Maryland jurisdictions and other service entities are to continue providing safe and adequate water services that support public health and the environment," said Maryland Department of the Environment Secretary Kendl P. Philbrick. "On behalf of the citizens of the state I thank the committee members for their generous time and expertise."

The report covers a broad range of issues from drinking water and wastewater security, chlorine use, water and sewerage planning, finance options for water and wastewater infrastructure by local governments and public awareness and technical assistance.

"We hope that this report will provide the basis for new programs and procedures at the state and local level to improve the overall management of water and wastewater systems," said Victoria Woodward, chair of the Water Security and Wastewater Systems Advisory Council.

"The report emphasizes the need to help small and mediumsized facilities address on-going operational and maintenance, and periodic capital improvement needs," added Steve McHenry, chair of the Interagency Technical Assistance Committee.

Report recommendations address many technical aspects related to the use of gaseous chlorine, liquid chlorine (sodium hypochlorite, more commonly known as bleach), and alternative disinfection technologies. The report also calls for greater vigilance to ensure the adequacy of water and wastewater facilities to serve existing and new development.

The report also updated 2001 estimates of wastewater capital from \$4.3 billion to about \$5.3 billion today. Much of the increased cost is attributable to Enhanced Nutrient Removal at wastewater treatment plants. The report also mentions the creation of the Bay Restoration Fund as a mechanism to fund this nutrient

removal program.

Other recommendations of the report include:

- · Seeking changes in the federal Clean Water Act to allow loan forgiveness and longer repayment terms to make state water quality loan programs more affordable;
- · Encouraging local governments to perform utility rate studies to keep water and wastewater systems self-supporting;
- · Encouraging development of regional facilities where feasible and practical;
- · Improving citizen awareness of the need for adequate funding of water quality infrastructure through educational messages targeted to ratepayers.

Enforcement & Compliance Notes --Oct. 15 to Nov. 15, 2004--

Air & Radiation Management Administration

Schmidt Baking Company, Inc. (Schmidt) - Baltimore County-On Oct. 19, MDE issued a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$10,000 to Schmidt for violations of air quality regulations. Schmidt operates a commercial bakery plant in Baltimore County. During a compliance inspection conducted by MDE, the inspector identified numerous months where the Company did not conduct visible emissions observations of its exhaust stack as required by its operating permit. Monitoring and record keeping are key requirements of the operating permit to help ensure compliance. Status: Schmidt has 10 days to request a meeting concerning the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 04-15)

Lehigh Cement - Carroll County-On Oct. 26, MDE issued a Corrective Order to Lehigh Cement ordering the facility to submit a Plan within 30 days to address various air quality violations. The Order addresses federal air toxics violations, visible emissions violations, and nuisance dust violations. MDE received many citizen complaints concerning dust from the Lehigh plant falling on personal properties. MDE investigations confirmed excessive cement dust being emitted from the cement storage facility creating an air pollution nuisance on citizens' properties. Status: Lehigh has 10 days to appeal the Order. (Reference #AQCP 04-10-02)

Kaydon Ring & Seal - Baltimore City—A Baltimore City Circuit Court Judge has recently approved a Joint Motion to Amend Consent Decree between MDE and Kaydon Ring & Seal. Kaydon operates a piston manufacturing plant in Baltimore. The Motion clarifies language in an existing Consent Decree previously signed by Kaydon and MDE. The Decree was for chromium and volatile organic compound violations and contained a \$50,000 penalty and \$198,000 in supplemental environmental projects. The amended language clarifies expenditure of the project funds, which included paving a parking lot to reduce particulate emissions and installing a new freon-free process chiller. Status: Case Closed. (Reference #AQCP 24-C-02000818)

Water Management Administration

Greenbelt Metropark, L.L.C., Prince George's County – On Nov. 5, MDE and Greenbelt Metropark L.L.C. finalized an administrative Consent Order resolving alleged violations of sediment control, water pollution and waterway construction laws associated with construction activity at the Greenbelt Station

Metro Planned Community located at the former A.H. Smith mining site in Branchville, Maryland. Under the terms of the Consent Order, Greenbelt Metropark L.L.C. has agreed to pay \$15,000 to the Maryland Clean Water Fund and to comply with an MDE issued Stop Work Order until an approved sediment control plan has been obtained from the Prince George's Soil Conservation District and implemented and MDE has received a delineation of the mapped flood plain on the site and confirmed that future proposed work will not result in adverse flood risk upstream or downstream of the property. Status: Case closed. (Reference# CO-05-0048).

Precision Collision Car Care Center, Anne Arundel County -On Nov. 5, MDE issued an administrative Complaint, Order and Penalty against Precision Collision Car Care Center located in Annapolis, Maryland for alleged violations of the total petroleum effluent limitations and self-monitoring requirements of State Groundwater Discharge Permit 01-DP-2475. The Order requires the facility to submit to MDE delinquent Discharge Monitoring Reports and a corrective action plan for review and approval to address improvements to the wastewater treatment system within 30 days. The action seeks an administrative penalty of \$13,000. Status: Case pending. (Reference #AO-05-0043).

Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, Prince George's County - On Oct. 20, 2004, MDE and the Washington **Suburban Sanitary Commission** (WSSC) finalized a penalty settlement to resolve Total Nitrogen and Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD) effluent violations as well as an 8 million gallon unlawful discharge of nondisinfected wastewater to the Patuxent River from WSSC's Western Branch Wastewater Treatment Plant that occurred in April 2004. Under the terms of the settlement, WSSC has agreed to pay \$105,424 to the Maryland Clean Water Fund. Status: Case closed. (Reference # PS-05-0046).

Water and Sediment Pollution Penalties – Statewide

During the period October 15, 2004 to Nov. 15, MDE collected an additional \$2,500 to the Sediment Fund in resolution of alleged erosion and sediment control/sediment pollution violations from two sites and \$2,400 to the Clean Water Fund in resolution of alleged water pollution violations at three facilities.

Waste Management Administration

Soil Safe, General Services Administration and Cherry Hill Construction - Baltimore City – Soil Safe, General Services Administration and Cherry Hill Construction were issued Com-

ing that goal."

"We know what causes lead poisoning in children and we know how to prevent it," the Governor added. "In 2004, there is no excuse for a single child in Maryland to suffer from lead poisoning."

In a decade, Maryland has reduced the number of children with elevated lead levels by roughly 90 percent, both in Baltimore, where the largest at-risk population is found, and around the state. Much of the decline is the result of prevention efforts on the part of property owners. Increasingly aggressive and effective testing programs and enforcement, especially in areas where children are at risk, have also heightened awareness and lead abatement activity.

"Maryland's Lead Poisoning Prevention Program works when property owners comply with registration requirements of the law," MDE Secretary Kendl P. Philbrick said. "There is virtually zero lead poisoning in compliant housing. Virtually all poisoning occurs in non-compliant properties. That is why it is vital

that these units be identified then made lead safe."

The rental registry is important for a number reasons:

- 1.) Required by law as part of standards to be met by property owners for a liability cap;
- 2.) Provides a listing of properties identified as posing a potential lead paint hazard;
- 3.) Registration fees provide a significant funding source for state lead poisoning prevention activities.

The public uses information in the registry when searching for rental housing. MDE and other enforcement entities use the registry in determining property owner compliance with lead hazard risk reduction requirements.

The first mailing targeted Baltimore City and nearby jurisdictions. But come the spring, MDE will be undertake another mass mailing with the emphasis on the rest of the state –aiming to further close gaps in the lead registry.

The effects of lead poisoning may result in poor school performance, inability to read, aggressive behavior, hearing loss or even mental retardation.

Award honors Carroll for protecting drinking water

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency recently awarded the Carroll County Board of Commissioners a source water protection award for its efforts to protect the drinking water sources of the county. In April, the commissioners adopted a water resource

management ordinance that sets standards to ensure land-use activities occur without polluting water and provides enforcement procedures for violations. The county also published a manual that outlines its master resource management plan.

The permit required that Hopkins measure NOx emissions from the boilers periodically and calculate monthly NOx emissions. Hopkins reported in its required six-month report that it failed to conduct all the required measurements and calculations on numerous occasions. **Status:** Hopkins has 10 days to request a meeting concerning the Penalty. Northwest Hospital Center – Baltimore County--On Oct. 6, MDE issued a Notice of Proposed Penalty in the amount of \$20,000 to Northwest Hospital Center. The Hospital operates a medical waste incinerator subject to federal medical waste incinerator regulations that require annual stack testing, monitoring of operating parameters, and periodic reporting. A recent incinerator stack test revealed that the Hospital incinerator failed to meet emissions standards for hydrochloric acid, violating the federal incinerator regulations. A retest of the incinerator demonstrated a return to compliance with the hydrochloric acid standard. Status: Northwest has 10 days to request a meeting concerning the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 04-10)

Air Products Polymers, L.P. (Air Products)— Cecil County-On Oct. 12, MDE issued a Notice of Assessed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$12,000 to Air Products for air quality violations. Air Products operates an emulsion manufacturing facility that is a "major" source of volatile organic compounds as defined in the Clean Air Act, making it subject to operating permitting regulations. MDE issued an operating permit to the Company in May 2000.

Based on an evaluation of required reports submitted by the Company, MDE determined that the Company had not conducted monitoring and record keeping for its equipment as required by its Title 5 operating permit. The

violations occurred over a period of several months. The violations have since been corrected. Status: Air Products has 30 days to request a hearing concerning the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 04-13A)

Water Management Administration

Town of Emmitsburg, Frederick County -On Sept. 17, MDE and the Town of Emmitsburg finalized an administrative consent order regarding improvements to Emmitsburg's wastewater treatment plant and collection system to address sanitary sewer overflows and bypasses. Under the terms of the consent order, Emmitsburg has agreed to construct improvements to the Little Run Sewer Main by July 31, 2005 and to evaluate the sewer system improvements and submit a progress report by October 31, 2005 regarding the efficacy of the improvements in eliminating sanitary sewer overflows, bypasses and ensuring the wastewater treatment plant's ability to maintain compliance with permit effluent limitations. The consent order also requires that Emmitsburg not authorize or approve new connections to the sewage collection system in excess of 20 equivalent dwelling units (EDUs) per year without prior approval from MDE. Emmitsburg has also agreed to pay \$5,500 to the Maryland
