## Federal budget notes \$10 million for Bay

President Bush's 2005 budget proposal will include an unprecedented \$10 million for competitive grants to reduce pollution entering the Chesapeake Bay. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Mike Leavitt, joined by Maryland Gov. Robert Ehrlich to announce Jan. 27 at the Chesapeake Bay program office in Annapolis.

The \$10 million will fund a regional pilot program implementing projects to reduce nutrient discharges to the Bay. The regional pilot funding is part of the president's budget request of \$25 million for watershed initia-

## Bills seek to improve programs

Wastewater treatment plants in Maryland would be able to put upgrades on the fast track with passage of Senate Bill 320/House Bill 555, which would create the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Restoration Fund.

The fund, proposed by the Ehrlich Administration, would impose a \$2.50 monthly fee on most customers of sewage treatment plants. Proceeds from the fee – about \$66 million a year – would be used to repay bonds sold to finance upgrades to Enhance Nutrient Reduction (or ENR) at major plants in Maryland.

The 66 largest plants in the state would be eligible for the grants. Plant operators would

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# Maryland, others call for stricter plant controls

Maryland and other states in the Northeast have called for strict caps on nitrogen oxides (NOx), sulfur dioxide (SO2) and mercury emissions from U.S. power plants and a shorter timetable for reducing power plant emissions.

The Ozone Transport Commission (OTC) – representing 13 states and the District of Columbia – proposed the caps in response to the Environmental Protection Agency's Interstate Air Quality rulemaking and the Clear Skies Initiative, both of which would allow more pollutants to enter the air.

"These pollutants cause acid rain, ground-level ozone and fine particle pollution," said Kendl P. Philbrick, Maryland's acting secretary of the environment, "and are the main causes for poor air quality in the Baltimore-Washington region. Because the pollutants that affect Maryland often originate in states to the west and south of Maryland, we need better pollution controls on power plants outside of Maryland and we need them as soon as possible."

Maryland's air quality is affected by emissions from out-ofstate sources, particularly coalfired power plants, because prevailing winds carry the pollutants from states to the west and south. The process is known as air pollution transport. Using special aircraft, state researchers often measure incoming pollution levels that are already at 90 percent of the standards.

Absent solution of the transport problem, Philbrick said, the state will not be able to achieve the air quality standards required by the deadline set by the federal Clean Air Act – around

2010 – and as a consequence both the Maryland economy and transportation planning will be hobbled.

"This is an issue of great importance to states in the Northeast, but it really goes beyond the interests of a single region," Philbrick said. "It requires that every state understand and take responsibility for actions that affect people beyond its borders - in this case, for upwind states to require effective controls on plants that are sending pollutants into Maryland and the Northeast. We look forward to working with all the states, the EPA and Congress to adopt OTC's approach to reducing acid rain and ground-level ozone."

OTC member states have already achieved a 70 percent reduction in emissions from 1995 levels, according to Christopher Recchia, executive director of the organization, while the rest of the country has reduced emissions only by about 10 percent in this period.

"The EPA proposal, as with Clear Skies before it, proposes the right method – a cap and trade program for NOx and SO2 – but fails to reduce emissions sufficiently to meet the health standards," Recchia said. "As a result, tens of thousands of additional premature deaths would occur, needlessly, which we could avoid if the OTC position is put into effect."

Over the past year, a variety of pollution reduction plans have been proposed. The OTC resolution most closely shadows the reductions originally proposed in the EPA's 2000 "Straw Proposal," where it outlined the reductions needed to meet National Ambient Air Quality Stan-

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## Grant will buy 1.7 million gallons of cleaner fuel

Public transportation serving East Baltimore will be burning clean diesel fuel for the next year, the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) and the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) announced Jan. 9.

A grant from the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) combined with state transportation funds will make it possible for the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), an MDOT division, to buy 1.7 million gallons of ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel for the 165-bus fleet that serves East Baltimore communities.

"This project will have an immediate and noticeable impact on East Baltimore," said Kendl P. Philbrick, Acting Secretary of the Environment. "The air will be cleaner along the routes served by these buses. This is effective environmental justice at the grassroots level."

The funding - \$100,000 plus nearly \$40,000 in matching funds from the Maryland Department of Transportation and MDE – comes from an EPA program that pays for demonstration projects across the country. The money will be used to pay the difference between the cost of regular diesel and ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel.

MDE's proposal was one of seven selected from among 39 applications, according to Donald S. Welsh, EPA Administrator for the Mid-Atlantic Region.

"We congratulate the Maryland Department of the Environment for taking a major step in

protecting the health of Maryland residents. The use of ultralow sulfur fuel will go a long way in reducing the amount of particle pollution in Baltimore, one of the most heavily-traveled urban corridors in the mid-Atlantic region," Welsh said.

"Of course," Welsh added, "this project would not be possible without the enthusiastic support from the Maryland Department of Transportation's transit administration."

MDOT Secretary Robert L. Flanagan said, "The cooperative efforts between the Maryland Department of Transportation, the Maryland Department of the Environment, and the Environmental Protection Agency have resulted in our ability to purchase a cleaner upgraded fuel



and proves that the benefits of public transportation do not have to be gained at the expense of the environment. We look forward to the possibility of further improvements."

The East Baltimore fleet, which is based at the Eastern Maintenance Facility on Oldham Street, travels routes in Rosedale, Foxridge, White Marsh, Oliver Beach, Towson, Westview, Security Square, and downtown.

Philbrick said that one of the considerations in the decision to target East Baltimore is MDE's Environmental Benefits District initiative, which targets low income and rebuilding communities. The initiative is designed to coordinate efforts by MDE and other state agencies to solve a

range of problems – including environmental problems – in these communities.

It is expected that MTA will begin using ultra-low sulfur fuel by March. Each bus will display a "Cleaner Buses for Cleaner Communities" sign.

continue to be responsible for installing Biological Nutrient Reduction (or BNR) technology with a matching grant from MDE.

If the bill is adopted during the 2004 legislative session, ENR upgrades could be complete by 2011. As of press time, amendments to the bill sought to add septic system owners to the measure.

#### **Brownfields reform**

Following on the brownfields reforms announced by Governor Ehrlich last year, the administration is proposing additional steps to make the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) more effective. Senate Bill 186/House Bill 294, based on the recommendations from the work group chaired by Del. Maggie McIntosh, would increase fees for applying to the voluntary brownfields program

and make them non-refundable, make properties under active enforcement eligible for the VCP, improves public participation and worker protection, speeds up the review and approval process, expands liability protection for corporations and local governments and provide harsher penalties for owners who ignore orders to clean up their properties.

"When enacted we believe the legislation will increase activity in the brownfields/Voluntary Cleanup Program," said MDE Waste Management Administration Director Jonas Jacobson. "Generally, it will be easier for properties to enter [the program] and be cleaned up."

Jacobson added the bill is important because it assists in utilizing abandoned sites and restoring contaminated ones-doing away with "urban blight" and contaminated sites by encouraging cleanup that will lead to jobs and increases in an area's tax base. "Brownfields can be a lightning rod for bringing back a whole community or neighborhood," he said. "There are so many positive benefits to this program."

Among the program's goals is to clean up more properties.

There's already been a 40 percent increase in applications since administrative changes were implemented last year. Jacobson's personal vision is to double the number of approved sites and applications to about 70 per year.

As of press time the legislation had passed the House of Delegates and the Senate was scheduled to vote within days.

## Maryland to receive \$2.9M for natural resources efforts

Governor Robert L. Ehrlich. Jr., recently commended U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman for targeting \$2.9 million to Maryland as part of a \$5 million effort to help improve natural resources in the Delmarva Peninsula.

"Improving the quality of the Chesapeake Bay is my top environmental priority. This additional funding for Delmarva will provide much needed conservation resources to Maryland's agricultural community," said Governor Ehrlich. "The additional resources being provided by USDA support our efforts to improve conservation while also ensuring that farms remain economically viable."

"The health of the Chesapeake Bay is an important issue," Secretary Veneman said. "This

funding will help to protect farmland and wildlife habitat. restore freshwater and tidal wetlands, as well as support the economic viability of agriculture in this region."

Programs to protect the Chesapeake Bay involve both federal and state efforts. The 2002 Farm Bill authorizes USDA to direct funds toward the ecologically and economically important agricultural lands. Governor Ehrlich has helped to target conservation funds toward this region.

USDA will use the Farm and Ranch Lands Protection Program (FRPP), Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP) and Wetlands Reserve Program (WRP) to provide additional financial and technical assistance

## Bayfront beach town among first to adopt enhanced treatment

Chesapeake Beach will be one of the first municipalities in Maryland to have a state-of-the art wastewater treatment plant, the Secretary of the Environment announced Feb. 20.

Maryland Department of the Environment Secretary Kendl P. Philbrick said that the current agency budget includes \$50,000 to plan the upgrade of the town's plant, the first step in adopting Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) technology. The Board of Public Works will be asked to approve the expenditure in the near future.

"Governor Ehrlich has made it one of his highest priorities to install the best technology available in Maryland's major wastewater treatment plants," Philbrick said. "It is fitting that Chesapeake Beach will be among the first to achieve maximum nutrient removal."

The order in which plant upgrades will be funded has not been established, but Chesapeake Beach is expected to be among the first, Philbrick said. Priority will be determined by the reduction achieved by the upgrade and the readiness of each plant to begin the project.

The town was one of the first jurisdictions to upgrade its plant to Biological Nutrient Removal (BNR), over a decade ago.

"We are absolutely thrilled," Gerald Donovan, the mayor of Chesapeake Beach said. "We want to take the lead and join the governor in his effort to restore the Chesapeake Beach to its former health."

BNR technology reduces nitrogen in effluent to 7-8 milligrams per liter. ENR will further reduce the amount of nitrogen to 3-4 milligrams per liter. Nitrogen is a major factor in the deterioration in the quality of the bay.

Governor Robert L. Ehrlich has proposed legislation that would finance upgrades at the 66 major wastewater treatment plants in the state. The fund

would impose a monthly \$2.50 fee on households (or household equivalents in the case of businesses) served by wastewater treatment plants. Proceeds – about \$66 million a year – would be used to pay off bonds sold to finance the upgrades.

While there are hundreds of wastewater treatment

plants in Maryland, the 66 major plants – including Chesapeake Beach – produce 95 percent of sewage effluent into the bay and its tributaries, and reducing nitrogen to 3 milligrams per liter at those plants will reduce the amount that flows into the estuary by an estimated 7.5 million pounds per year.

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tives. This is a \$10 million increase over 2004 funding.

"This major increase in funding demonstrates the president's commitment to improving the quality of America's watersheds," EPA Administrator Mike Leavitt said. "The selection of Chesapeake Bay for this pilot reflects the urgent need to protect the health of this national treasure that just happens to be in our front yard."

"The Bay's health depends on federal support and the president's generosity here today demonstrates his serious commitment to a cleaner Bay," said Maryland Governor Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr. "This funding is a signal of the merit of a cleaner Bay, a message I will continue to take to Washington."

The Chesapeake Bay pilot is designed to encourage innovative projects wherein sewage treatment plants collaborate with non-point sources in the watershed to reduce nitrogen and phosphorus loadings.

The Chesapeake Bay funding is being requested as a blue ribbon panel prepares to begin deliberations next month on financing options for the bay's restoration. The panel, created last month by state and federal officials on the Chesapeake Executive Council, is scheduled to report its recommendations by

October of this year.

The financing will help support aggressive new goals set by the executive council to improve water quality in the Chesapeake Bay. Regional Bay restoration leaders have committed to dramatic reductions in nutrients and sediments entering the Bay, a major expansion of stream-side forest buffers and an initiative to more than double the protective and nurturing underwater grasses in the bay.

Pollution reduction plans and water quality standards being developed by Bay region states and the District of Columbia will help guide efforts to attain the stringent nutrient and sediment goals set by the executive council.

The president's budget request will fund EPA's newly renamed targeted watershed grant program, which is a competitive grants program begun two years ago to produce innovative strategies for protecting and restoring the nation's watersheds. The first round of grants were awarded last spring, with 20 watershed organizations across the country receiving nearly \$15 million.

#### Air & Radiation **Management** Administration

Oxon Hill Animal Hospital - Prince George's County-On Dec. 23, MDE received an Administrative Penalty payment of \$800 from Oxon Hill Animal Hospital for failure to renew registration of a radiation machine facility within the prescribed timeframe. Status: Case closed. (Reference #RHP 03-19)

Dr. Howard Kessner - Baltimore City—On Dec. 29, MDE and Dr. Kessner entered into a Consent Order Agreement to resolve compliance issues outlined in a May 2003 Complaint, Order, and Administrative Penalty. The facility received the Complaint for failing to undergo state certification for its radiation machine. The Agreement requires a penalty payment in the amount of \$1,000. The facility has since returned to compliance. Status: Dr. Howard Kessner has 30 days to pay the Penalty. (Reference #RHP 03-06)

**Huber Welding Service, Inc.** - Baltimore County—On Dec. 31, MDE issued a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$7,000 to Huber Welding Service, Inc. The Company was cited for the disturbance of asbestos-containing material. The Company was not licensed to disturb asbestos, the workers were not properly

trained, and good engineering practices and reasonable precautions were not used in the disturbance of the asbestos. Status: Huber Welding Service, Inc. has 10 days to request a meeting concerning the Penalty. (Reference #RHP 03-18)

S & S Graphics - Prince George's County—On Jan. 12, MDE signed a Consent Order with S & S Graphics to resolve an air quality enforcement case. S & S Graphics operates a commercial printing facility. During an inspection, MDE determined that the Company had not conducted observations and inspections of its equipment as required by its air quality operating permit for a period of several months. Monitoring and record keeping are requirements of the operating permit to ensure compliance with air quality requirements. The Consent Order requires S & S to implement a plan to ensure future compliance and to pay a penalty of \$9,000. Status: S & S Graphics has 30 days to pay the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 040112)

#### Dry Cleaners Enforcement Actions—

On Jan. 13, MDE issued Notices of Proposed Civil Penalties to six dry cleaning facilities for violations of their permit limits and of federal air toxics record keeping requirements. The penalties range from \$500 to \$1,000. MDE inspections determined that the six dry cleaners significantly exceeded the 450-gallon annual limit for solvent usage contained in their permits. The dry cleaners also failed to keep proper operating and solvent inventory records. Status: The Dry Cleaners have 10 days to request a meeting on the Penalty. (Refer-#AOCP 03-12 through 03-17)

to landowners on Delmarva. Maryland will receive nearly \$2.9 million in additional funding in these three programs for nine Eastern Shore counties.

The Delmarva Peninsula drains into the Chesapeake Bay, the nation's largest and most productive estuary. Delmarva contains

about 1.7 million acres of farmland. The high concentration of livestock, sandy soils, flat topography, intense agriculture, and development pressures significantly impacts the use of natural resources, environmental quality, and the overall economic viability of the region.
