Supreme Court knocks down challenge to Clean Air Act

Rejecting an industry challenge to the Clean Air Act, the U.S. Supreme Court on Feb. 27 upheld the process the Environmental Protection Agency uses to set clean-air standards.

The decision, which was not expected

until June, rejected claims from the American Trucking Association questioning whether the EPA should consider economic factors when proposing air quality standards under the Clean Air Act.

The Clean Air Act "unambiguously bars cost considerations" from the process, "and

thus ends the matter for us as well as the EPA," Justice Antonin Scalia wrote in the court's opinion.

Citing the EPA's interpretation of one part of the Clean Air Act as unreasonable, the court ruled against the agency's process for implementing new ozone standards when ozone levels exceed the maximum amount allowed.

"We therefore find the EPA's implementation policy to be unlawful," Scalia wrote. "It is left to the EPA to develop a reasonable interpretation" of standards.

The setback didn't deter EPA supporters from calling the high court's ruling a win.

"This decision is a victory for the Clean Air Act and for the health of the American people," American Lung Association leader John R. Garrison told the Associated Press.

Under the authority provided in the Clean Air Act, part of the nation's ongoing attempts to control air pollution, the EPA proposed revised standards for ground level ozone and fine particulate matter commonly referred to as smog and soot.

Under the new regulations submitted in 1997, EPA proposed to phase out its previous one-hour primary ozone standard

and replace it with an eight-hour standard. For particulate matter, EPA proposed a new standard for fine particulate matter of 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) to complement its current particulate matter standard, PM₁₀, which refers to the size of the particulate matter.

"The new standards will protect 125 million Americans, including 35 million children, and will prevent approximately 15,000 premature deaths every year, as well as avoid one million cases of significant lung function decrease in children and 350,000 cases of aggravated asthma," an EPA spokesman said.

In testimony to the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works on Feb. 7, 1997, EPA Administrator Carol

Browner said the revisions were long overdue since the standards had been revised only once since 1971 — the ozone standard in 1979 and the particulate matter standard in 1987.

A report conducted by the Congressional Research Service titled "Clean Air Act Issues in the 106th Congress" agreed with Browner.

"The net impact of the promulgated standards would be increased stringency. For

Agencies work to address state's overflows

The Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) has continued its efforts over the past few months to address the consistent overflow problems at the combined and sanitary sewer systems throughout the state.

The sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) and combined sewer overflow (CSO) problem is a significant one in Maryland and throughout the United States. The total cost for improvements necessary to repair or replace infrastructures to completely eliminate the overflows in Maryland has been estimated to be as high as \$1.7 billion, according to an EPA model developed to estimate capital costs for controlling overflows nationally.

In an effort to improve the lines of communication, MDE issued a letter Oct. 5, 2000, to all owners and operators of sanitary sewer systems and combined sewer systems in Maryland. The letters, which were hand-delivered by compliance program staff, called for notification to MDE via telephone within 24 hours of an overflow event and listed specific information that should be provided.

It also required that a follow up letter, containing a summary of the overflow event, what has been done to eliminate the overflow and prevention of another occurrence, be submitted to MDE within five days of the incident.

Shortly after issuing the letter, MDE officials began tracking reported overflows in a database and following up via site visits and telephone calls when calls were received.

MDE has noted an increase in the number of reports since October, particularly whenever there is moderate to heavy precipitation.

According to Thomas C. Boone, director of the Compliance Program in MDE's Water Management Administration, the department, which has taken hundreds of reports of spills since 1996, received 460 reports of sewer spills between Jan. 1, 2000, and July 31, 2000. Of those 460 overflow reports, 283 did not quantify the amount spilled.

Last fall, MDE began coordinating with local health directors, public works officials and other interested parties to develop a guide document that assists owners, operators and health department officials in deciding when public notification is needed and what form it should take.

Richard Eskin, manager of the environmental health and risk assessment program at MDE, led that effort.

"We think it best if notification is handled at the local level by the people most familiar with the area and situation," Eskin said. "We want to provide the public with the knowledge they need to minimize or eliminate any health risks resulting from a release so they will not unknowingly expose themselves."

MDE has also advised the owners and operators of sewage systems that it will notify the public if the local responsible party decides not to give notification about an overflow event it believes people should be warned about.

MDE's Compliance Program in the Water Management Administration reviews the circumstances related to sewage spills and takes enforcement actions such as the issuance of corrective orders and/or the assessment of penalties, in many cases when adequate caution or preventive measures could have prevented unauthorized discharges.

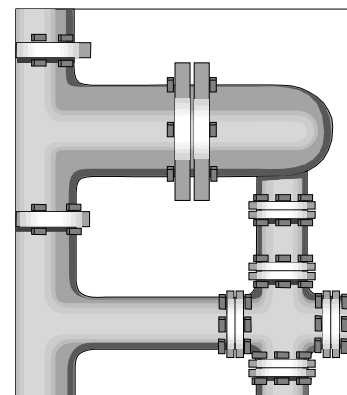
The program, which also receives separate monthly reports about discharges associated with the eight CSO communities in Maryland, routinely alerts MDE's Shellfish Certification and Drinking Water programs about spills that may represent a threat to shellfish or drinking water intakes. As a result, temporary closures of shellfish harvesting areas and protective measures to prevent water plant con-

tamination may be implemented.

Twenty-four municipal systems have already been identified as potential candidates for formal enforcement actions to address on-going SSO or CSO problems. MDE plans to proceed with the negotiation of judicial consent decrees or administrative consent orders to bring needed attention to systems with repeated problems. In the event that agreement cannot be reached, MDE will proceed with an appropriate unilateral action that the municipality may appeal if it so desires.

The Environmental Protection Agency has also focused attention on SSOs and CSOs as an enforcement initiative. EPA officials have said that their SSO regulations, which will come out in the next year, will set a two-year time period for achieving compliance.

MDE has joined with EPA and the U.S. Department of Justice in the pursuit of several enforcement cases in Maryland involving large municipal systems that have reported many hundreds of overflow events. These cases are in various stages of development and negotiation.

Maryland schools receive TEHA grants for projects

The Tidewater Environmental Health Association (TEHA), a private, nonprofit environmental organization based on Maryland's Eastern Shore, awarded \$1,000 to the Franklin Montessori School of Gaithersburg, in Montgomery County recently.

The money will be used for the development of a nature center created by students between the ages of three and five-years-old, which will include raising and planting indigenous plants, bird feeders and workstations.

"I dreamed of creating a nature center where children could grow plants and learn about nature and the environment," said teacher Roberta Herrmann, who accepted the award on behalf of the Franklin Montessori School. "Thanks to the TEHA grant, my dream will become a reality."

Two additional Maryland schools were presented with TEHA grants Feb. 7.

St. Mary's School of Bryantown, in Charles County, was awarded \$432 for the development of a butterfly garden/nature area, including a park bench made from recycled plastic lumber. Students in grades

six through eight will complete the project.

Queen Anne School of Upper Marlboro, in Prince Georges County, received a \$1,000 award for development of a nature area/schoolyard wildlife habitat and permanent outdoor education site. The site is designed to educate students and visitors about wetlands, forest streams and wildlife habitat. Sixth and seventh grade students will develop the project.

TEHA's membership consists of sanitarians and environmental health professionals from state, county, other government agencies and the private sector. Many Maryland Department of the Environment employees are members of TEHA.

One of TEHA's major functions is promoting environmental education to its members, citizens, and public and private school systems in Maryland. As a result, TEHA created the Educational Fund Screening Committee (EFSC) in 1998. The committee investigates, screens and selects ideas for promoting environmental and public health education in the state. In this program, EFSC sends out notices to school systems re-

questing submission of science project proposals.

In order to facilitate its mission, EFSC

holds several fundraisers, one of which is the annual bike tour at Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge in Cambridge.

Coastal bays, reservoirs among TMDL activities for 2001

The Maryland Department of Environment (MDE) has submitted nearly 30 Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL) analyses — estimates of the maximum pollutant loading capacity for a particular water body — to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency since December 2000.

Since TMDLs create a framework for environmental management into the future, MDE has a goal of reaching a cumulative total of 46 TMDLs submitted to EPA by the end of 2001, out of about 350 due to by the end of 2008.

TMDL-related projects on which MDE staff are presently working can be grouped into three broad categories: field operations, model development and TMDL analysis and documentation. These activities represent the sequential steps in the multi-year TMDL development process.

Field operations consist of water quality sampling and measurements of other water body characteristics including stream channel geometry, tides and stream flows. In coordination with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), the Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin (ICPRB), the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and the states of Virginia, West Virginia and Pennsylvania, MDE began a two-year monitoring initiative in the Potomac River Basin in October 2000. The information collected during this initiative, with other information, will be used to develop watershed and

water quality models.

A number of environmental computer simulation models are at various stages of development. Several models are in preliminary development stages, and will eventually be used to conduct TMDL analyses for submittal to EPA in 2002 or 2003. These projects include Baltimore Harbor (nutrients and toxic substances), Back River (nutrients and toxic substances), the Pocomoke River and tribu-

taries (nutrients), the Chester River and tributaries (nutrients), the Choptank River, Eastern Bay, Miles River and Wye River. A full tentative TMDL submittal schedule for 2002 can be found on MDE's website at: www.mde.state.md.us/TMDL

Several model development projects being completed and several TMDL analyses being conducted are included on the tentative schedule of submittals

to EPA in 2001. They include the Northern Coastal Bays (Assawoman Bay, Isle of Wight and St. Martin's River), the southern coastal bay (Newport Bay), Baltimore's two drinking water reservoirs (Loch Raven and Prettyboy), Swan Creek, the Sassafras River, the Northeast River, Still Pond Creek and Worton Creek. A full tentative TMDL submittal schedule for 2001 can also be found on MDE's website.

Habitat stewards help others attract, protect wildlife

(NAPSD)--To some people, especially those living in urban areas, enjoying nature and wildlife means packing up and heading off to the park or the forest. But thanks to a program developed by the National Wildlife Federation® (NWF), more and more people are learning to cultivate and enjoy nature's wonders right in their own backyards.

NWF's Backyard Wildlife Habitat Program^a allows participants to have their yards certified as official Backyard Wildlife Habitat sites when they provide native wildlife with food, water, cover and places to raise young. And, despite the name, habitats aren't restricted to backyards; the

program is open to schoolyards, workplaces, churches, community centers--just about anywhere that can foster a suitable environment.



Because starting a habitat project can be challenging, NWF created Habitat Stewards, who serve as the program's volunteer training and mentoring extension. The

program is sponsored by Wild Birds Unlimited, a leading backyard bird-feeding and nature specialty franchise.

According to Alicia Craig-Lich, senior manager of nature education for Wild Birds Unlimited, Inc., Habitat Stewards connects trained volunteers with those who need help starting habitat projects.

"Volunteers receive intensive training to equip them with the knowledge and tools needed to assist others in developing and managing wildlife habitats," she said.

The Habitat Stewards training sessions are coordinated and led by Habitat Stewards Hosts, individuals or organizations working in official partnerships with NWF to administer the program.

"Creating habitats is a growing trend," said Jean White, Habitat Stewards Program coordinator for the NWF. "The program empowers individuals to make positive changes for the conservation of wildlife and wild places. The habitat experience often facilitates people's first discovery of amazing creatures and the environment around their homes and in their communities."

To date, more than 27,000 habitats have been certified and more than 700 Habitat Stewards have been trained.

the days following the fuel spill. As the accident left Route 198 closed for several hours, ERD members worked until 11 p.m. to coordinate off-loading of the remaining gasoline and took measures to prevent additional soil contamination. MDE spearheaded the cleanup efforts and was involved in excavating a 6-foot wide, 3-foot deep swathe that extended nearly 100 yards to remove any gasoline-contaminated soil from along the roadside.



Q. I obtained all the permits I needed to start my business. Do I need to do anything else for MDE?

A. In almost every situation, obtaining the appropriate permits is only the start of your environmental obligations. Almost every permit will have record keeping or reporting requirements and you may be subject to some of these requirements even if your operations do not require a permit to operate. To keep this column to a reasonable length it will address the typical requirements for air. Columns over the next two months will address typical requirements for waste and water.

Proper record keeping is of critical importance since paperwork is one of the key things an inspector will review when your business is inspected. All of these records are used to demonstrate that you are operating in compliance.

The typical air permit to construct for small businesses, such as printers or auto body shops, will require you to track the materials you use. You should be able to track this through purchasing records from your suppliers.

Using a body shop as an example, you would need to keep track of how much paint, primer, and other coatings you use. The air regulations for vehicle refinishing require monthly records of the total volume and the volatile organic compound (VOC) content of the coatings, cleanup materials and surface preparation materials purchased. By keeping a file with copies of your purchase records by month you can easily determine how much you use in a year. Material safety data sheets (MSDS) for the products used should specify their VOC content. The regulations also contain calculations for determining VOC content as applied and if you need help with these calculations contact the Small Business Assistance Program at (410) 631-3772. You should have records for at least the past three years as well as a copy of your permit and a copy of the application you submitted available for an inspector to review. There may be situations where you need to keep records for five years.

You should also compare your actual usage with the usage you submitted on your application. If you find that you are using significantly more

the new ozone standard, 332 counties have pollutant concentrations above the standard, as compared to 189 under the old standard. The new particulate standard is expected to bring at least 100 new counties into nonattainment status as well. Such an increase in the number of nonattainment areas would have broad implications for the states, affected industries, economic sectors such as agriculture, transportation, and individuals," the study's authors concluded.

These factors include increased costs for pollution control measures by industry and agriculture as well as development of new requirements for inspection and enforcement of the new standards by the states.

Although the proponents of the new standards disagree, some industry supporters put the cost of compliance under the proposed standards as high as \$50 billion.

The proposed standards were widely supported by public health experts, but strongly opposed by many industry groups including electric utilities, oil, automobile, trucking, chemical and paper companies. EPA's basic authority to regulate and adopt the new standards based on the provisions of the Clean Air Act and the U.S. Constitution had under scrutiny.

After trying unsuccessfully to have Congress block the proposed standards, the American Trucking Association and three dozen additional plaintiffs sued the EPA in federal court. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit ruled May 14, 1999, that EPA had unconstitutionally usurped legislative powers in the adoption of its revised standards for ground level ozone and particulate matter.

The court contended that the EPA had demonstrated no "discernable principle" on which to set the proposed standards and in the absence of a clear standard, it was impossible for the agency to determine at which level the standards should be set. According to court documents, the EPA

could "set National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) at any point between zero and a hair below the concentrations yielding London's Killer Fog." Therefore, the court sent both the new ozone and particulate matter standards back to the EPA.

Rather than give up their fight, the EPA filed an appeal with the U.S. Supreme Court. The American Trucking Association then filed a cross-appeal questioning whether the EPA should consider economic factors when pro-

posing air quality standards under the Clean Air Act. The Supreme Court agreed to hear the cross-appeal and bundled the two cases together for their review on Nov. 7, 2000.

The Supreme Court's Feb. 27 ruling will either bring into check an agency (EPA) that fails to use good science to further its own agenda or allow EPA to continue in its on-going efforts to clear the air for future generations.

Meanwhile, officials at the Maryland Department of the Environment are considering how

the agency will address any possible changes.

"Maryland continues to gear up for the new standards. We are now following the guidance and timetables developed by the EPA for both the new ozone and particulate matter standards," said Tad Aburn, Program Manager for MDE's Air Quality Planning Program. "We are prepared to develop any additional necessary actions plans based on the Supreme Court's recent decision."

Clean Air Act's history began in the 1940s

The federal government took its first tentative steps into the world of air pollution control in the early 20th century when the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Mines looked into the possibility of controlling smoke and oil by-products.

It wasn't until a serious thermal inversion and its resulting deadly air pollution killed 20 people in Donora, Pa., in October 1948, that pushed the federal government to start the process of codifying its clean air policy. In 1955, \$5 million was allotted for air pollution research and control. (Kevin Johnson, American Trucking Association vs. EPA)

Initially, air pollution was viewed and treated as strictly a local problem. That changed during the Kennedy and Johnson

administrations with the passage of the 1963 Clean Air Act. It is believed that Kennedy was motivated, in part, by killer smog episodes in London and New York. While the 1963 Act recognized air pollution as a national problem, it did little to establish or enforce national air quality standards.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was established by Executive Order on Dec. 2, 1970. But it was not until President Nixon signed the Clean Air Act of 1970 into law 28 days later that national standards and enforceable state compliance measures were added to the act.

Among the revisions contained in the 1970 Act was the ability for the administrator of the EPA to set National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). Under

this authority, EPA has set national air quality standards for ground level ozone (smog), particulate matter (soot), carbon monoxide, lead, sulfur dioxide and nitrogen dioxide. The act also directs the EPA to review the standards for each of these pollutants every five years.

The act was again amended in 1977 to reflect on-going congressional concern about clean air issues. Then, as more concerns were raised in the 1980s about acid rain, smog and air-borne toxins, consideration was given to further amendments. Debate on the act lasted most of the decade until the revised Clean Air Act was signed into law Nov. 17, 1990. The amended law is now the major controlling legislation affecting clean air issues in the United States.

or less material than you originally indicated, you might need to update your permit. Contact the Air Quality Permitting program at (410) 631-3230 for more information on updating these numbers for your business.

Inspectors will also need to verify that the materials and equipment you are using comply with regulations. They will also need to make sure you have the required permits for your equipment. The inspector will check for compliance with every

condition in your permit, so it is very important that you read and understand the conditions. You should contact the department if you have questions about any of the conditions in the permit you received.

It is helpful to set up a system to ensure full and continuous compliance with all the applicable standards and requirements.

You should set and follow policies and practices for your business that will keep you in compliance all the time. The benefit is that a good sys-

tem can enable you to identify and address any problems before an inspector shows up.

If you have questions about specific record keeping requirements for your situation, the Environmental Permits Service Center can help you find the answers. Contact the program at (410) 631-3772.
