Note: Unless otherwise noted, medication should never be poured down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or flushed down the toilet!

** Prince George's County recommends that medication be crushed and mixed with dirt and placed in a sealed container.

*** Inhalers, syringes (needles), drugs in aerosol canisters, or chemotherapy drugs are not accepted.

**** Montgomery County recommends that medication be placed into a sealable plastic bag or empty container, mixed with kitty litter, coffee grounds or sawdust, sealed, and then put into regular household trash.
