







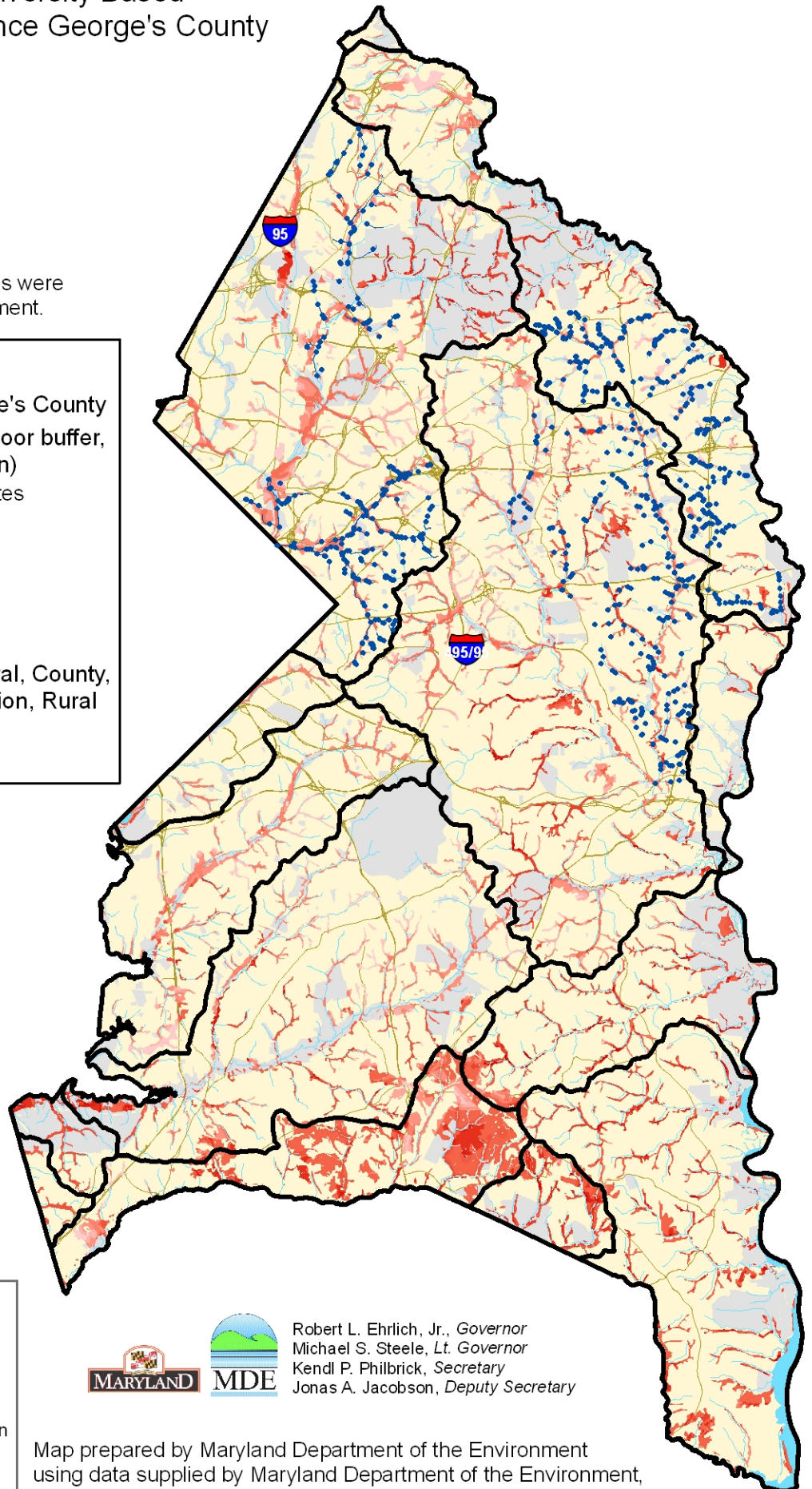
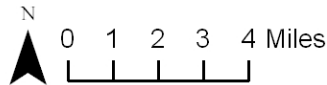


Priority Sites for Biodiversity Based Wetland Restoration in Prince George's County
