WATER AUDITS and LOSS REDUCTION REPORT 2017

Water audits are conducted to determine the amount of water lost from a distribution system due to leakage, storage overflow, water theft, and/or water meter malfunctions. A comprehensive audit can provide the water system with a detailed profile of the distribution system and the water uses allowing for more effective management of the resource and infrastructure.

As a condition of the water system's Water Appropriation and Use Permit, water audits are usually required for water systems serving greater than 10,000 people. Audits are completed annually using data from the previous year and report on how efficiently the systems are operating. When water loss is greater than 10%, it triggers submission of a water loss reduction plan.

For calendar year 2017: The State had 31 water systems serving a population greater than 10,000 people. Twenty-nine of these systems completed an audit and 55% of the systems reported water loss below 10%, while 45% reported more than 10% water loss. Collectively these 29 water systems produced 106.5 billion gallons (bg) of water in 2017. Of those billions of gallons, 14.4 bg were lost.
